⁵ For all cases with staff or academic appointee respondents and cases with student respondents investigated prior to 1/1/2016, the deciding authority is the Title IX Office. For cases with student respondents that were investigated on 1/1/2016 or later, the deciding authority is the Office of Student Support and Judicial Affairs (OSSJA).

⁶ For student respondents the sanctioning authority is OSSJA. For cases with academic appointee respondents, the sanctioning authority is the Office of Academic Affairs. For staff respondents, the sanctioning authority is the appropriate manager of the department.

⁷ The sanctions are based on the severity of the offense. "Other Sanctions" for student respondents can include Deferred Separation; Counseling with Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Intervention Services; and Transcript Holds.
