³ In all cases where possible, Complainants and Respondents were informed of the campus and community resources available to them and were offered personal and academic support.

⁴ "Insufficient information or grounds" includes: lack of identifying information about the Complainant and/or Respondent; desire of the Complainant to not pursue an investigation; and Respondent was not affiliated with UC Davis.

⁵ The sum of the uninvestigated and investigated report values does not equal the total number of reports of sexual violence and other prohibited behaviors because some investigations included multiple Respondents with different investigation outcomes.

⁶ For all cases with staff or academic appointee respondents the deciding authority is the Title IX Office. For cases with student respondents the deciding authority is the Office of Student Support and Judicial Affairs (OSSJA).

⁷ For student respondents the sanctioning authority is OSSJA. For cases with academic appointee respondents the sanctioning authority is the Office of Academic Affairs. For staff respondents the sanctioning authority is the appropriate manager of the department.

⁸ "Other Sanctions" can include Deferred Separation; Counseling with Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Intervention Services; and Diploma and/or Transcript Holds.
